AND

THE HIDES 4 APDL 7 LICENCE PROJECT AREA LANDOWNERS referred to in of
Schedule 1 of this Agreement. *(of the Fourth Part)*

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PNG LNG HIDES 4 APDL 7 LICENCE BASED BENEFITS SHARING AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made the _____ day of December 2009

BETWEEN:

THE INDEPENDENT STATE OF PAPUA NEW GUINEA ("the State") of the first part;

AND

THE SOUTHERN HIGHLANDS PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT (SHPG) of the second part

AND

KOMO LOCAL LEVEL GOVERNMENT (of the Third Part)

AND

THE HIDES 4 APDL 7 LICENCE PROJECT AREA LANDOWNERS referred to in Schedule
1 of this Agreement. (of the Fourth Part)

WHEREAS

- A.** The State signed the PNG LNG Gas Agreement on 22nd May 2008 with the LNG Project Companies. This Agreement provides the commercial and fiscal terms for the PNG LNG Project.
- B.** The PNG LNG Coordinated Development and Operating Agreement (CDOA) signed amongst the LNG Project Companies provide the essential commercial framework for the LNG Project. The CDOA defined the commercial concepts and the desire of the LNG Project Companies to jointly develop various gas fields and the associated gas from oil fields.
- C.** The State, the affected Provincial Governments, the affected Local Level Governments and the affected Project Area Landowners signed the Umbrella Benefits Sharing Agreement in Kokopo on 23rd May 2009 (**"UBSA"**).
- D.** The parties acknowledge that the signing of the PNG LNG Umbrella Benefit Sharing Agreement was an important milestone in the project schedule.
- E.** The parties acknowledge that the State has the stewardship for working with the LNG Project Companies to progress and bring it to fruition.
- F.** The Parties recognize that Project Area Landowners, Provincial Governments (PGs) and Local Level Governments (LLGs) are important stakeholders for the success and stability of the LNG Project
- G.** The Parties recognise the need to adhere to the project schedule and to work cooperatively and expeditiously to this end.

- H. The Parties acknowledge that the signing of the PNG LNG LBSA in Hides 4, Southern Highlands Province is an important milestone in the project schedule.
- I. The Project Area Landowners, PGs and LLGs recognise that the PNG LNG Project is an integrated project and it was necessary to capture under the Umbrella Benefit Sharing Agreement the basis for sharing of their benefits under existing laws and any additional benefits provided by the State.
- J. The Parties recognise that PNG LNG Project is of national importance and the benefits accruing to the State are for the collective benefit of the people of Papua New Guinea.
- K. The Project Area Landowners, affected PGs and LLGs are entitled to certain benefits under existing policies, laws and agreements, in particular the sharing of benefits provided by the State under the UBSA and this Agreement.
- L. The Parties understand that this Agreement capture the sharing of benefits allocated to Hides 4 APDL 7 under the Umbrella Benefit Sharing Agreement.
- M. This Agreement records the sharing of benefits between the Project Area Landowners, the SHPG and LLGs, following a process of consultation, awareness conducted by DPE and the UBSA Forum process of consultation and agreements reached under the UBSA, resulting in the Development Forum and the signing of this Agreement pursuant to Section 48 of the Oil and Gas Act (as amended).

1. GENERAL

1.1 UBSA

The parties agree that:-

- (i) the Terms of the UBSA are incorporated and effected into this Licence Based Benefits Sharing Agreement or Development Agreement;
- (ii) There are no new, additional commitments or Benefits offered by the State at this Licence Based Forum;
- (iii) This Licence Based Forum is primarily to allow the National Government to facilitate the sharing of benefits packages, agreed at Kokopo as applied to the Hides 4 APDL 7 Licence area; and
- (iv) The Project Area Landowners remain as detailed in Schedule 1 of this Agreement and is subject to Ministerial determination of the ILG beneficiaries.

1.2 Cooperative Development

The Parties recognise and expressly acknowledge that:-

- (i) The rationale and principles stipulated in the CDOA especially the basis for cooperative development of underlying fields, energy contribution, basis of equity determination, provision for re-determination and the integrated nature of the PNG LNG Project from upstream to pipeline to liquefaction plant are fundamental to the commercial structure of the LNG Project;

- (ii) Cooperative development means that the timing of benefits accruing from equity is detached from the timing of actual development and gas production from a specific field/PDL;
- (iii) All benefits, referred to in this Agreement are wholly dependent on the continuation of the production and sale of gas by the LNG Project, and if production and sale of gas is interrupted, suspended or discontinued, all benefits conferred by this Agreement and the Licence Based Benefits Sharing Agreements shall be interrupted, suspended or discontinued until such time as production and sale of gas is resumed by the LNG Project;
- (iv) This Agreement has been executed in accordance with Part IV of the Oil and Gas Act and [in compliance with the Consent Orders dated 28th of April 2009 in Proceedings Digimu Landowners Association Inc –v- Rendle Rimua & 3 Ors – OS No. 201 of 2009];
- (v) This agreement is contingent upon the LNG Project successfully progressing into final investment decision, financial close and commencement of commercial production;
- (vi) If LNG Project Companies abandon or put on hold the LNG Project, this Agreement will be terminated or put on hold and the State will have no obligation to confer benefits described in this Agreement.

2. DEFINITIONS

2.1 General

In this Agreement, the following definitions apply unless the context otherwise requires:

"Act" means the *Oil and Gas Act 1998*, as amended.

"Buffer Zone" has the same meaning given by the Act

"CDOA" means the Coordinated Development and Operating Agreement signed between the LNG Project Companies on 13 May 2008 in relation to the LNG Project.

"DPE" means the Department of Petroleum and Energy or such other successor Department responsible for petroleum matters.

"FEED" means the Front End Engineering and Design phase of the LNG Project.

"FRPG" means Fly River Provincial Government;

"Gas" means natural gas as defined in the Act;

"GPG" means Gulf Provincial Government;

"Hela Province" means the proposed Hela Province that will gain full political and legal status as a province upon completion of all political and legal processes and after the 2012 National General Election;

"ILGs" means land groups incorporated under the *Land Incorporated Groups Act (Chapter 147)* by the Project Area Landowners and

recognised by the Minister through a Ministerial Determination pursuant to the Act.

"IPBC" means the Independent Public Business Corporation of Papua New Guinea as established by the *Independent Public Business Corporation of Papua New Guinea Act 2002*.

"Kokopo Umbrella Benefit Sharing Agreement Forum" or *"the UBSA Forum"* means the consultative group meetings held over a period of three to four weeks from April to May 2009 leading to the execution of the Umbrella Benefit Sharing Agreement (UBSA);

Kroton No. 2 Limited ("Kroton") means a company incorporated under the *Companies Act 1997* and which is a wholly-owned subsidiary of IPBC.

"Licence Based Benefits Sharing Agreement" means Development Agreement provided for under Section 48 of the Act and refers to the Benefits Sharing Agreement/s executed pursuant to the Act and Clause 15 of the LNG Gas Agreement and executed at the Development Forums convened for negotiation and sharing of benefits between the Project Area Landowners, Provincial Governments and Local Level Governments from each Licence Area.

"LNG Gas Agreement" means the Agreement signed on 22nd May, 2008 between the State and the LNG Project Companies to develop the LNG Project,

"Minister" means the Minister for the time being responsible for administering the Oil and Gas Act or any preceding and succeeding act, as the context so requires.

"MRDC" means the Mineral Resources Development Company Limited established under the *Mineral Resources Development (Privatisation) Act*;

"Petroleum Processing Facility Licence Area (PPFL)" means the LNG Liquefaction Plant and Buffer Zone Area.

"PNG LNG Project Umbrella BSA" means the Umbrella Benefit Sharing Agreement executed between the parties on the 23rd of May 2009 that forms the basis on which Licence-Based Benefit Sharing Forums will be held and which is referred to in Clause 15 of the LNG Gas Agreement

"Project area landowners, landowners or project affected landowners" has the meaning given in the Act and for the purposes of this Agreement and in relation to the LNG Project shall denote:

- (i) those affected project area landowners of any part of a PDL which is an LNG Project Licence Area as described hereunder, or that PDL granted in respect of Hides 4 APDL 7,
- (ii) customary landowners owning land located within any pipeline easement defined in any Pipeline Licence, or owning land which is the subject of a Petroleum Processing Facility Licence in either case forming part of the LNG Project Area; and
- (iii) the customary landowners of the area of a Petroleum Development Licence, a Buffer Zone, a pipeline easement or a

Petroleum Processing Facility Licence, which area becomes part of the LNG project area.

"Project Area Landowner Representative(s)" means the representative(s) selected for Hides 4 APDL 7 Licence Benefit Sharing Agreement Forum Meetings under Clause 6 of this Agreement.

"SHPG" means Southern Highlands Provincial Government;

"UBSA" means the Umbrella Benefit Sharing Agreement signed at Kokopo on 23rd of May 2009;

2.2 Definition used in the LNG Project Gas Agreement

The following words when used in this Agreement have the meanings ascribed to them in the LNG Project Gas Agreement as in effect at the Agreement date:

"Affiliates"

"Conversion of Fields to LNG Project Fields";

"FEED";

"Field or gas field";

"Integrated project";

"LNG Project Fields";

"LNG Project Gas Pipeline";

"LNG Project";

"LNG Project Area";

"LNG Project Liquefaction Plant";

"LNG Project Petroleum"; and

"Upstream Facilities".

2.3 Definition used in the Coordinated Development and Operating Agreement

The following words when used in this Agreement have the meanings ascribed to them in the CDOA:

"Project Substances"

"Value Determination"; and

"Value Re-Determination".

2.4 Definition used in the UBSA

The following words when used in this Agreement have the meanings ascribed to them in the UBSA:

"Total Benefit Package"

"Equity Benefits"

"CDOA";

"Kroton Equity"

3. INTERPRETATION

3.1 Rules of Interpretation

The following rules of interpretation apply to this Agreement;

- (i) The headings do not affect the interpretation or construction of this Agreement;
- (ii) References to an act or provision of an act includes the amendments to that act for the time being in force and also to any legislation or regulation passed in substitution thereof;
- (iii) A reference to a Party to this Agreement or Parties to this Agreement includes that Party's or Parties' successors, and

permitted assigns and, where applicable, the Party's or Parties' legal personal representatives;

- (iv) references to a Recital, Clause, Schedule or Attachment are to a recital, clause, schedule or attachment of this Agreement;
- (v) if there is any conflict between the body of this Agreement and the Schedules or Attachments, the body of this Agreement prevails to the extent of the inconsistency; and
- (vi) if there is any inconsistency between the provisions of this Agreement and the Act, the Act will prevail to the extent of the inconsistency.
- (vii) A reference to conduct includes any omission and statement or undertaking, whether or not in writing.

4. SCOPE

4.1 Effective Date and Term

This Agreement commences on the date of its execution and will terminate on the earlier of:

- (i) the date the LNG Project Gas Agreement terminates; or
- (ii) the date the LNG Project Companies decide not to proceed with the LNG Project; or
- (iii) the date on which the UBSA will terminate as a consequence of the termination of the LNG Gas Agreement and/or the LNG

Project companies deciding not to proceed with the LNG Project.

4.2 LNG Project Licences

The LNG Project Licences are those licences referred to in Clause 4 (Scope) of the UBSA.

5. FORUM PROCESS AND REPRESENTATION

5.1 Requirements of the Act

The parties acknowledge that the law provides for the Social Mapping and Landowner Identification Studies (SMLIS) to be completed by the Project Developers or Licensees under Section 47 of the Act. A Development Forum is then convened by the Minister under Section 48 of the Act. And under Section 50A; Development Agreement must be signed at the conclusion of the Development Forum. Under Section 49 of the Act, the Minister must be satisfied with the SMLIS and socio-economic studies before he invites the Project Area Landowners, Provincial Governments and Local Level Governments to the Development Forum. The Social Mapping Report for the Licence Area has been submitted and accepted by DPE, thus providing the basis for the Minister to convene the Hides 4 APDL 7 Licence Based Development Forum at Hides 4 wellhead near Para village.

5.2 Requirements of Forum Process (Prior to Informed Consent)

The Parties agree that this Development Agreement has been developed:

- (i) On the basis of consultation and negotiation between the landowners, Provincial Government and the State leading to the signing of the Umbrella Benefit Sharing Agreement at Kokopo on the 23rd of May, 2009;
- (ii) On the basis of consultation, field awareness and clan vetting exercise conducted by DPE LNG Team at the Project site with the Hides 4 APDL 7 Project Area Landowners beneficiaries and all issues relating to the impact of the LNG Project on the Project Area Landowners were discussed; and
- (iii) Accordingly, the Project Area Landowners have agreed to be represented by their representatives at the Development Agreement Forum to negotiate and to sign this Development Agreement.

5.3 Project Area Landowners

The parties acknowledge that:

- (i) the Minister's invitations to Project Area Landowner representatives were issued in accordance with the Act;
- (ii) Social Mapping and Landowner Identification Studies were undertaken by the LNG Project Companies and a clan vetting exercise was conducted by the DPE;
- (iii) All landowner representatives invited to attend the forum were selected by the clans themselves and are from clans within the Licence area identified pursuant to the exercises mentioned in (ii) above;

- (iii) there was at least women representatives selected by Project Area Landowners at a meeting organized by DPE in the field and the representative is from a clan identified in the Social Mapping and Landowner Identification Studies undertaken by the LNG Project Licencees and vetting exercise undertaken by the DPE; and
- (iv) a number of prominent persons in each Licence Area were selected in meetings organized by DPE for the Project Area Landowners to select Project Area Landowner representatives to attend the Licence BSA Forum discussions.

The parties further acknowledge that:

- (i) the quotas set by DPE for numbers of representatives who were invited by the Minister for this Licence Area were appropriate to the availability of conference facilities for the LBSA development forum meetings;
- (ii) the Project Area Landowner representatives at this Development Forum were authorized by Project Area Landowners of the Hides 4 APDL 7 Project Licence Area, at the meeting organised by DPE to negotiate this Agreement on behalf of their tribes or clans; and
- (iii) the authorization for these representatives to attend the LBSA Forum does not mean recognition by the State for them to perform other roles as the representatives of their clans and further the State is not responsible for any remuneration for the performance of any such roles on behalf of their clans.

5.4 Provincial Government

The Southern Highlands Provincial Government (SHPG) shall be represented by its Provincial Governor or his delegate who shall sign on behalf of the Southern Highlands Provincial Government.

5.5 Local-Level Government

- (i) The Komo LLG shall be represented by its President and in his absence by an authorized nominee, accompanied by a Ward Councilor or Councilors from the Project affected LLG area.
- (ii) The President of the Komo LLG is authorized to sign this Agreement for and on behalf of his LLG and in his absence an authorized nominee may sign.
- (iii) DPE has provided a quota for the numbers of representatives and other representatives to be selected by the Project Area Landowners in meetings organised by DPE in the Project Area and clan leaders and other representatives so selected are from clans identified in the Social Mapping and Identification Studies Report.

6. TOTAL BENEFITS PACKAGE

6.1 CDOA and Kroton Equity Benefits

- (i) The equity benefits to all affected PNG LNG Project area Landowners, Provincial Governments and Local Level Governments are set out in the UBSA and consist of:-

- (a) an estimated 2.78% interest arising from entitlements by virtue of participating interest in the existing PDLs and by virtue of the 2% interest accruing to the Project Affected Landowners (*CDOA Equity*);
 - (b) an estimated 4.22% equity by virtue of a commercial option for undivided and fixed shareholding of 25.75% in Kroton No.2 Limited;
- (ii) CDOA equity is to be shared between PDLs and Pipeline and Plant in the ratio of 72:28%;
- (iii) CDOA equity is to be shared between Landowners and LLGs of the Licence Area in the ratio of 90:10; and
- (iv) The CDOA equity and Kroton equity provided by the State are described in detail under Clause 6 of the UBSA.

6.2 Equity Benefits Distribution Mechanism

The Parties agree to the distribution mechanism of the Equity benefits as follows:

- (i) The equity benefit available to Affected Area Landowners and LLGs consist of the following:
 - (a) an estimated Project interest (CDOA equity) of 0.1694% provided by the State to be shared between the Landowners and LLGs in the ratio of 90:10;

- (b) an Equity option to acquire 2.32% in Kroton No.2 Limited to Landowners provided by the State on commercial terms described under Clause 6 of the UBSA; and
 - (c) the terms, definitions and details explanation of CDOA and Kroton Equity provided by the State are set out in Clause 6.2 and 6.3 of the UBSA.
- (ii) Clans in Hides 4 APDL 7 that were identified in the Social Mapping and Landowners Identification Report and the DPE clan vetting exercise have after two weeks of protracted negotiations, agreed to the regional distribution of CDOA Equity as follows:

- (iii) The relevant clans of the Licence Area acknowledge their relatives represented at the Hides 4 APDL 7 Licence Based Development Forum, living outside the Licence area and will endeavour to share their CDOA benefits from the LNG project with those said relatives;
- (iv) The relevant clans of the License Area acknowledge their desire to tithe up to ten percent (10%) of their CDOA benefits and will endeavour to do so pursuant to an appropriate distribution mechanism.

- (v) Clans identified in the Social Mapping and Landowners Identification Report and the DPE clan vetting exercise have after two weeks of protracted negotiations, agreed to the regional distribution of the Kroton Equity as follows:

- (vi) The relevant clans of the Licence Area acknowledge their relatives represented at the Hides 4 APDL 7 Licence Based Development Forums, living outside the Licence area and will endeavour to share their CDOA benefits from the LNG project with those said relatives;
- (vii) Following the Agreement for Kroton and CDOA equity sharing at the regional level the beneficiary clans or sub-clans of the Hides 4 APDL 7 Licence Area are required to complete their negotiations on benefits sharing within three (3) months from the date of the signing of this Agreement or 15 January 2010 (whichever occurs first). If agreement is not reached on benefit sharing amongst the beneficiary clans or sub-clans, then the Minister will determine benefit sharing for the clans or sub-clans in accordance with the Act;
- (viii) The Minister will confirm the recognised beneficiaries entitled to receive CDOA and Kroton equity benefits by publishing a Ministerial Determination in the National Gazette.

- (ix) The Clans recognised by the Minister have to be incorporated into ILGs for the purpose of receiving CDOA and Kroton equity benefits under the LNG Project.
- (x) The Clans agree that they will establish a special purpose authority, Hides Special Purpose Authority which will be their vehicle for the distribution of benefits under this Clause.

6.3 Re-Determination and Review of CDOA Equity

- (i) The Parties acknowledge the agreement reached under the UBSA that equity interest in the LNG Project allocated to each Licence is partly determined by the Project Substances contributed from each PDL and will undergo adjustments in line with the re-determinations under the CDOA. However, the principles agreed under the UBSA will not change.

6.4 Royalty

- (i) A royalty of 2% calculated as per the provisions of the Act and the PNG LNG Gas Agreement is provided by the State to the Landowners, Provincial Governments and Local Level Governments.
- (ii) It is reaffirmed that under the UBSA, the royalty benefits provided by the State under the LNG Project will be shared between the affected PDL, Pipeline and Petroleum Processing Facility Licence Landowners, Provincial Governments and Local Level Governments.

- (iii) It is reaffirmed that under the UBSA that in term of sharing of royalty benefits:
- (a) in the first instance, the PDL Area and Pipeline and LNG Plant Area Landowners will share in ratio of 72:28 (PDL Area 72%, and Pipeline and LNG Plant Areas 28%);
 - (b) The 72% portion will be shared between PDL area landowners, and the affected PGs and LLGs in the ratio of 70:30 (with landowners getting 70% and affected PGs and LLGs getting 30%);
 - (c) The sharing of 30% of the royalty benefits will be negotiated and agreed between the PDL affected PGs and LLGs at a forum to be organised by the State as part of the BSA process;
 - (d) The sharing of 70% of the 72% royalty amongst the PDL area landowners was negotiated and agreed to in the UBSA. The 12% allocation for Hides 4 APDL 7 is determined under the CDOA and reflected in the UBSA. The PDL area landowners acknowledge their relatives living outside of the licence area and will endeavour negotiate and agree to share their 12% benefit with those said relatives during the Licence Based Development Forum
 - (v) For purposes of Clause 6.3 (v) PGs refer to SHPG, FRPG and GPG and LLGs refer to Komo LLG, South Koroba LLG, North Koroba LLG, Hayapuga LLG, Hulia LLG, Lake Kutubu LLG, Erave LLG, West Kikori LLG and Nomad LLG.

- (vi) Clans identified in the Social Mapping and Landowners Identification Report and the clan vetting exercise carried out by DPE, after two weeks of protracted negotiations, agreed to the distribution of royalty as follows:

- (vii) The relevant clans of the Licence Area acknowledge their relatives represented at the Hides 4 APDL 7 Licence Based Development Forum, living outside the Licence area and will endeavour to share their CDOA benefits from the LNG project with those said relatives;
- (xi) The relevant clans of the Licence Area acknowledge their desire to tithe ten percent (10%) of their Kroton equity benefits and will endeavour to do so pursuant to an appropriate distribution mechanism.
- (xii) Following the Agreement for Kroton and CDOA equity sharing at the regional and tribes level the beneficiary clans or sub-clans of the Hides 4 APDL 7 Licence Area are required to complete their negotiations on benefits sharing within three (3) months from the date of the signing of this Agreement or 15 January 2010 (which ever occurs first). If agreement is not reached on benefit sharing amongst the beneficiary clans, then

the Minister will determine benefit sharing for the clans, tribes and villages in accordance with the Act.

- (xiii) The Minister will confirm the recognised beneficiary clans entitled to receive CDOA and Kroton benefits by publishing a Ministerial Determination in the National Gazette.
- (xiv) The Clans recognised by the Minister have to be incorporated into ILGs for the purpose of receiving CDOA and Kroton equity benefits under the LNG Project.

6.5 Business Development Grant

- (i) The Parties to this Agreement note that the State agreed to make available under the UBSA an amount of Kina 120 million to assist landowners' companies in business development activities, in accordance with guidelines to be approved by NEC and Section 171 of the Act.
- (ii) The Parties further note that the National Executive Council has apportioned the sum of K120 million to all Licence Area Landowners and consequently allocated K15 million to Hides 4 APDL 7 Licence area landowners under NEC Decision No. 59 of 2009.
- (v) The Parties that the Business Development Grant shall be made available in accordance with the guidelines to be approved by the National Executive Council.
- (iv) The Seed Capital Grant will be shared between the PDL area landowners and LNG Plant and Pipeline area landowners in

72:28 ratio respectively. For the avoidance of doubt, none of the PGs or LLGs will be beneficiaries to this grant. The State will give due recognition of the difference between a green-field and a brown-field PDL while determining further apportionment of the seed capital funding amongst the PDL area landowners.

- (v) The Parties agree that an Umbrella LANCO will be established to represent all beneficiaries in Hides 4 APDL 7. The Umbrella LANCO is subject to the requirements of the IPA Act (1997), Social Mapping and Landowner Identification studies leading to a Ministerial determination of ILGs in the Hides 4 APDL 7.
- (vi) The Parties agree that the election of the ILG representatives will be conducted by the Electoral Commission of PNG and DPE.
- (vii) In the interim, the Umbrella LANCO will be governed by a Committee to be established with the assistance of DPE and the Electoral Commission in a meeting with the representatives listed under Schedule 1 of this Agreement.
- (viii) The interim Committee of the Umbrella LANCO will be selected from the following regions:

• Middle	2

• Tawenda Marako	2
• Parepare	2
• Ketereanda	2
• Timala Kangulu	2

- Independent Member 1

- (ix) The Department of Petroleum & Energy will report the results and resolutions of the meeting to establish the interim committee to the Minister for endorsement and recognition.
- (x) The interim Committee will be tasked with establishing the Umbrella LANCO.
- (xi) The establishment of the Umbrella LANCO and the election of the LANCO Board members and officers shall be in accordance with Clause 6.5 (v); (6.5 (vi) and 6.5 (ix).
- (xii) After the establishment of the Umbrella LANCO the interim Committee, the DPE and the Electoral Commission will at the earliest possible time jointly call the first ILD Representative Meeting where they shall table a report detailing the establishment of the Umbrella LANCO. The ILG Representatives Meeting shall then be converted to a Shareholders Meeting whereby the ILG representatives shall elect officer bearers for the Umbrella LANCO and carry out further requirements of the Companies Act 1997.

6.5A Umbrella Association

- (i) The Parties agree that an Umbrella Company representing Landowners in Hides 4 APDL 7 will be established to oversee their overall welfare and social wellbeing, in accordance with the Associations Incorporation Act 1966; and the procedures and processes and representations set out in Clause 6.5(v) and subsequent Clauses.

6.6 Development Levy

- (i) A development levy of 2% calculated as per the provisions of the Act and the PNG LNG Gas Agreement is made available to the Provincial Governments and the Local Level Governments.
- (ii) It was agreed under the UBSA that the PDL PGs and LLGs will share the development levy with the Pipeline and LNG Plant PGs and LLGs in the ratio of 72:28 (that is 72% will be received by the PDL PGs and LLGs and 28% will be received by the Pipeline and LNG Plant PGs and LLGs).
- (iii) However, the disbursement of the development levy is subject to Clause 6.10 and 6.11 of the UBSA; noting that the SHPG has sought judicial review of the distribution mechanism stipulated under the Organic Law.

6.7 Infrastructure Development Grant

- (i) The parties to this Agreement acknowledge that the State agreed under the UBSA to an amount of Kina 1.2 billion allocated equally over two (2) five year periods, commencing 2010 or the date of the LNG Project Decision (whichever is the earlier), for infrastructure development and maintenance in the affected Provinces, in accordance with Section 173 of the Act.
- (ii) The parties to this Agreement agreed that the infrastructure grant approved by the National Government for Southern

Highlands Province will be utilized to fund projects at the PDL Projects Site, the LLG areas and in other parts of the Provinces.

(iii) The Parties agree that the amount of K100 million will be allocated to the Hides 4 APDL 7 project area landowners, Local Level Government and the Provincial Government to fund projects which are subject to Implementation mechanism referred to in Clause 13 of this Agreement. The projects identified are as follows:-

- a) Hulia Benaria Road;
- b) Margarima to Kandep Road sealing;
- c) Komo Township (2nd & 3rd Phase);
- d) Hiri-Lai Road Sealing);
- e) Hides 4 Growth Centre;
- f) Agriculture Projects;
- g) Emanapi Eco Tourism Centre;
- h) Tombete Community Centre;
- i) Housing Resettlement;
- j) Para Health Centre;
- k) Para Tawanda Bosavi Road;
- l) Rural Electrification ;
- m) Rural Water Supplies Program;
- n) Gangulu Haliago Road;
- o) Komo Womad Road;
- p) Markets Program;
- q) Komo Top-Up School;
- r) Walagu Health Centre;
- s) Kukupalu Community Centre
- t) Kukupalu Top-Up School
- u) International School

- v) Tiute Top-Up School
- w) Hides 4 Library
- x) Wild Life Management
- y) Hides 4 Resource Centre
- z) Hongote Police Station
- aa) Tagali Bridge
- bb) Hibagu Tagali Foot Bridge
- cc) Komo Coffee Project

- (iv) The parties to this Agreement acknowledge that the implementation of infrastructure projects in Hides 4 APDL 7 will be subject to the Implementation mechanism referred to in Clause 13 of this Agreement.

6.8 Future Generation and Investment Trust Fund Percentage

- (i) The Parties agree that in compliance with Section 176 of the Act;
 - (a) 30% of equity and royalty benefits will be set aside for future generations trust fund, and
 - (b) a further 30% of equity and royalty benefits will be for Community Infrastructure trust fund.

6.9 Future Generation Fund: Management

- (i) The Parties agree that subject to an NEC decision on this matter and the review provision under Clause 9 of the UBSA, the amounts assigned for future generation and community infrastructure will be managed by a corporate trustee managed by MRDC. Proper governance mechanism for

transparency, accounting, and audit and management representation will be put in place before the LNG Project Decision.

- (ii) the amounts assigned for future generation and community investment will be managed by a separate independent and professionally managed trust. Proper governance mechanism for transparency, accounting, and audit and management representation will be put in place before LNG Project Decision.

7. TAX CREDIT

- (i) Where the State agrees, to fund priority projects in Hides 4 APDL 7 under the Tax Credit Scheme the State will ensure that the operator of the LNG Project manages the implementation of the Tax Credit Projects in accordance with Section 219C of the Income Tax Act 1959 (as amended).
- (ii) The State will use reasonable efforts to have tax credit projects are approved within reasonable a period and in accordance with the Tax Credit Scheme.

8. MANAGEMENT OF BENEFITS

8.1 Trustee Arrangements for Equity

- (i) The State undertakes to conduct through the Minister for Petroleum and Energy, a review of the current arrangement under this Clause by July 2010. The findings of such a review will be taken to the National Executive Council (NEC) and will form the basis on which NEC may determine any amendments,

as may be necessary, to such arrangements, taking into consideration Section 179 of the Act. The parties agree to abide by the decision of the NEC following such review.

- (iv) The CDOA Equity arising from new PDLs (including PDL 1 variation) and from the allocations made under Clause 6.3.1 and from the allocations made under this Agreement under clause 6.3.1 (iii) will be managed by MRDC with representation from the stakeholders.
- (v) Kroton No. 2 Limited shall be a clearing house and benefits will be paid direct to beneficiaries.
- (vi) The trustee companies, both under MRDC and newly established trust and the royalty trust under paragraph 9.2 of the UBSA will be subject to proper trust deed. In particular, the terms of the trust shall, at a minimum prescribe the following:
 - (a) Six (6) monthly audit by an independent firm of accountants;
 - (b) Regular rotation of trustee directors on a five yearly basis;
 - (c) Publication of half year and full year financial statements for the project area community;
 - (d) The publication of the investment policy of the corporate trustee;

- (e) The publication of the dividend policy of the corporate trustee; and
- (f) Filing of full financial statements with the annual returns filed with the Registrar of Companies

8.2 Trustee Arrangements for Royalty

Subject to clauses 6.6, 6.7, 6.8 and 14 of the UBSA, the royalty entitlements of the Project Area Landowners, the affected LLGs and PGs shall be managed an entity agreed to by the NEC following the review and/or by the nominated trustee companies which are subsidiaries of MRDC. The trustee companies shall execute formal deeds of trust in favour of named beneficiary Project Area Landowners and affected LLGs. The LNG Project companies will pay royalty directly to the trustee company.

8.3 Representation at LNG Project Joint Ventures Meetings

- (i) Subject to Clause 9.1 of the UBSA, the interests of the Project Area Landowners; affected LLGs and PGs in the LNG Project with respect to CDOA Paid Equity will be represented by MRDC and/or an entity agreed to by the NEC following the review.
- (ii) The interest of the Project Area Landowners, affected PGs in the LNG Project with respect to Kroton Equity will be represented by Kroton No.2 Limited
- (iii) The royalty and equity benefits of the Hides 4 APDL 7 project area landowners will be managed by a wholly owned subsidiary of the Mineral Resources Development Company

(MRDC) and/or an entity agreed to by the NEC following the review and will consist of Directors who are Chairman of the ILGs to be invited by MRDC or this entity in accordance with its rules and procedures, to be on the Board of the said subsidiary company.

9. LOCAL SUPPLIES AND BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT

9.1 Local Supplies and Business Development

- (i) The parties acknowledge that in accordance with the PNG LNG Gas Agreement, the LNG Project Companies are required to prepare a local business development program in respect of the local supply and business development provisions in section 129 of the Act.
- (ii) The State will use reasonable efforts to ensure that the LNG Project Companies fulfill their obligations under Section 129 of the Act in developing and implementing a local business development program so that opportunities are provided to Project Area Landowners and other Papua New Guinea citizens to participate in business spin-off activities provided by the LNG Project.
- (iii) The State will ensure that the local business development program prepared by the LNG Project Companies for the purposes of the PNG LNG Gas Agreement will include proposals which:-
 - (a) facilitate the business opportunities of experienced service providers currently providing services within

the LNG Project Area or for the Project in reference to project dedicated facilities;

- (b) create business opportunities for project area landowners who do not currently conduct business within the gas project area;
- (c) create business opportunities for any umbrella project area companies involved in providing services to the LNG Project.
- (d) So far as practical, the LNG Project Companies shall give first preference to service providers whose place of origin is in the gas project area provided that they have the requisite experience, managerial and trade skills, and business capacity to perform the work.

9.2 Consultation on the National Content Plan

The State will use reasonable efforts to encourage the LNG Project Operator to convene a series of meetings in order to consult the landowners on the development and finalization of a national content plan before commencement of "Early Works".

9.3 Landowner Companies

The Parties acknowledge the undertakings under the UBSA in relation to participation by Landowner companies in providing services to the LNG Project:

- (i) they must be financially and technically capable of the work they propose to perform;
- (ii) they must be able to provide their services competitively with international service providers on quality and price; and
- (iii) In accordance with the LNG Project operator business development plan, existing local companies must pre qualify as to skills and business abilities to be able to provide their services to the LNG Project.

9.4 Regulation of LNG Project Related Business Development

The Parties acknowledge the following requirements in relation to the regulation of the LNG Project related Business Development:

- (i) From the date of commencement of the LNG Project, the LNG Project Companies shall consult with DPE, Department of Commerce and Industry, and the Department of National Planning and Monitoring Development in relation to local procurement of goods and services, and the progress of the local business plan developed by the operator for the LNG Project.
- (ii) The Department of Commerce and Industry shall provide a detailed annual report of the activities of the landowner companies and a review of the LNG Project Operator business plan for the forthcoming calendar year and review the performance and success of each of the service providers which provide services to the LNG Project.

9.5 Local Business Development Monitoring Committee

- (i) Immediately following the execution of this Agreement, the State shall establish a committee to be chaired by the Secretary, Department of Commerce and Industry, entitled the Local Business Development Monitoring Committee to oversee, supervise and ensure that the obligations of all parties under this agreement are proceeding in full compliance with the terms and conditions agreed.
- (ii) The Committee will consist of senior representatives of key Departments of the State, the affected PG and 3 elected landowner representatives, MRDC, the Nominee Company of the State and at the discretion of the Chairman, a representative of the LNG project companies.

10. EMPLOYMENT AND TRAINING

10.1 The Parties to this Agreement accept and support the undertakings agreed under the UBSA in relation to employment and training as follows:

- (i) The parties acknowledge that the LNG Project Companies are required to prepare training and localization programs to be approved by the Department of Labour and Employment or a Department responsible for training and employment matters and in accordance with that plan will, where foreign personnel are employed, progressively replace such foreign personnel with PNG citizens as expeditiously as possible.

- (ii) The State will endeavor to obtain from the LNG Project Companies, alternative or revised plans, where the training and localization programs are disrupted by circumstances or events which make it difficult or impractical to comply with the obligations under these programs to achieve the objectives of that part of the training and localization program which is affected.
- (iii) The State shall provide to the LNG Project Companies such assistance as required in the formulation of the training and localization programs and the recruitment of citizens and shall make available its facilities for vocational and technical training.
- (iv) The State may, after consultation with the LNG Project Companies, require those companies or any of their contractors, to take such numbers (considering the scale and nature of the LNG Project Operations) of the State's employees or the employees of a State nominee at any time for managerial, professional or technical training as is appropriate for the qualifications and experience of the employees.
- (v) The State shall, after consultation require Affiliates of the LNG Project Companies will use its best endeavours to ensure that the LNG Project Companies give first preference in training to citizens whose place of origin is in the LNG Project Area (Hela region and Southern Highlands) on behalf of the LNG Project Companies and shall assign such employees to suitable training positions, whether in Papua New Guinea or overseas.

- (vi) The parties acknowledge that the LNG Project Companies will not be obliged to retain any such assigned employees undergoing training who fail to perform duties appropriate to the assignment.
- (vii) So far as practical, the State will use reasonable efforts to ensure that the LNG Project Companies give first preference in employment to citizens whose place of origin is in the LNG Project Area provided that they have the requisite skill and capability to perform the work.
- (viii) The State will use its use reasonable efforts to ensure that, prior to the commencement of the LNG Project, the LNG Project Companies consult with the Department of Labour and Industrial Relations and provide reports annually concerning training and localization and the progress of the training and localization plan as part of the LNG Project.

11. SUPPORT FOR LAND PROCUREMENT AND ACCESS

- (i) The State shall procure all land needed for the infrastructure proposals provided herein and customary landowners will give full cooperation in ensuring full and free access to officials of the State and to representatives of the LNG Project Companies and their contractors in undertaking all tasks relating to the survey, acquisition, construction and use of such infrastructure.
- (ii) Project Area Landowners, affected PGs, and LLGs agree not to impede or otherwise take any action that could endanger any individual, property or the process of infrastructure construction and will extend

support and assistance to facilitate the expeditious and cost effective construction of all infrastructures.

- (iii) Project Area Landowners, affected PGs and LLGs recognize that fair land compensation will be made for the acquisition of such land from the Project Area Landowners since the construction of the roads and other infrastructure will bring considerable benefits to the provinces, local areas and will enhance the standard of living, business opportunities and facilities for local landowners.
- (iv) Project Area Landowners, affected PGs and LLGs acknowledge that LNG Project Companies will not be liable for any loss, damage, injury or death or such liability for claims which may arise from or be incidental to the use of the roads or other infrastructure by any person in any way whatsoever.
- (v) The parties recognize that certain roads and infrastructure to be constructed by the LNG Project Companies are solely for use associated with the LNG Project for the duration of the LNG Project and that there will be no public access to such roads and infrastructure until the LNG Project ceases to operate.
- (vi) The Parties agree to provide land for the purposes of construction of permanent residential settlement and permanent infrastructure services for employees of LNG Companies within the project area.

12. IMPLEMENTATION MECHANISM

12.1 Expenditure Implementation Committee ("EIC")

The parties acknowledge the following understanding reached by the representatives to the UBSA with regard to the Expenditure Implementation Committee (EIC):

- (i) That EIC plays an important role in implementing socio-economic and infrastructure projects in compliance with the requirements of the *Public Finances (Management) Act 1995* and the Act.
- (ii) The parties agree that the EIC Guidelines are important in the implementation of the infrastructure projects either agreed under the Licence Based Benefits Sharing Agreements or any other infrastructure projects.
- (iii) The EIC will process and oversee the implementation of BSA infrastructure projects approved under each Licence Based Benefits Sharing Agreement.
- (iv) The project proposals submitted for funding under EIC Budget will only be approved by the EIC for expenditure when they are compatible with the EIC Guidelines and the Medium Term Development Strategy that is administered by the Department of National Planning and Rural Development and DPE.
- (v) The parties hereto agree that the EIC will be the authority responsible for the implementation of BSA infrastructure projects and that all projects to be undertaken are subject to the availability of funds.
- (vi) Where there is a change in law in relation to the EIC or as a result of a review under Clause 9, the parties agree to work

with and support any alternative implementing agency appointed by the State to succeed the EIC. The State will ensure that this alternative implementing agency complies with the requirements of this Clause.

13. ECONOMIC CORRIDOR IMPLEMENTATION AGENCY (ECIA)

The parties acknowledge that the process to establish the ECIA has commenced in accordance with NEC Decision 59/2009, and when formally established the ECIA will succeed the EIC and will be responsible for implementing the projects approved for funding under this Agreement.

14. GOVERNANCE, ACCOUNTABILITY AND COORDINATION OF PROJECTS AND PROGRAMMES

- (i) The parties agree that the benefits made available by the State under this LBSA are to be applied for the good of the present and future generations and are to be used to create a development base for the future.
- (ii) The parties agree that sound governance principles need to be put in place for proper accounting and use of benefits moneys.
- (iii) The parties agree that the development efforts by various agencies- the National Government, donor agencies, LNG Project Companies, affected PGs and LLGs- need to be coordinated to deliver economic infrastructure, social infrastructure and empower people to carry out gainful economic pursuits.
- (iv) The State, in consultation with the representatives of the Beneficiary Groups will draw up an integrated development programs and

projects and will get professional assistance in drawing up business plans and budgets both for capital expenditure and operating and maintenance costs.

- (v) The benefits under Clauses 6.1 (d), (e) and (f), 6.9 and 8 of the UBSA will be integrated and coordinated with National Government's Medium Term Development Strategy (MTDS) and Long Term Development Strategy (LTDS). The State with the approval of the NEC will draw up allocation, approval and governance process for monies granted under Clauses 6.1 (d) (e) and (f), 6.9 and 8.

15. ENVIRONMENT AND RELOCATION

- (i) The Parties acknowledge that an Environmental Plan has been approved for the PNG LNG Project in accordance with the Environment Act 2000.
- (ii) The Parties acknowledge that the relocation issue raised by the Hides 4 APDL 7 Licence area landowners and the State will as a matter of priority endeavour to facilitate meetings with the LNG Project Companies to address this issue.

16. SOUTHERN HIGHLANDS PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT (SHPG) UNDERTAKINGS

16.1 Representation

The SHPG will be represented by its Governor or his delegate for all purposes required by this agreement.

16.2 Support for Project

- (i) The SHPG affirms that it will support the LNG Project and this Agreement and use its best endeavours to ensure support for the LNG Project and the Benefits Sharing Agreements by the Project Area Landowners and other people of Southern Highlands Province whether or not such people are direct beneficiaries, or indirect beneficiaries through infrastructure development throughout the Southern Highlands Province.
- (ii) The SHPG agrees to collaborate with the EIC to apply development levies that may be available to the Southern Highlands Province to implement projects approved through the Southern Highlands Province annual Budgets infrastructure commitments by SHPG under this Agreement and the Licence Based Benefits Sharing Agreements.

16.3 Project Security

The SHPG shall assist the National Government in addressing threats from Project Area Landowners and non-project area landowners against the LNG Project personnel and property.

17. LOCAL-LEVEL GOVERNMENT UNDERTAKINGS

The following commitments have been accepted by the affected LLG of:-

- (i) Komo

17.1 Representation

- (i) The affected LLG will be represented by the President or his delegate and by the female nominated member of the LLG, for all purposes required by this Agreement.
- (ii) Where the LLG has not nominated a female member to the LLG or where the nominated female member of a LLG is unavailable, the LLG will be represented by the President or his delegate, for all purposes required by this Agreement.

17.2 Support for Project

- (i) The Komo LLG affirms that it will support the LNG Project and this Agreement and use its best endeavours to ensure support for the LNG Project by the Project Area Landowners and other peoples of the LLG area whether or not such people are direct beneficiaries.
- (ii) The Komo LLG agrees to cooperate with the State to apply development levies and infrastructure grants that may be available to implement approved projects.

17.3 Project Security

The affected LLG shall assist the Provincial and National Governments in terms of dialogue with the local communities and project monitoring of landowner activities in addressing threats from Project Area Landowners and non-project area landowners against LNG Project personnel, property and operations.

18. PROJECT AREA LANDOWNER UNDERTAKINGS

- (i) Access to land for project development shall be provided by landowners in accordance with the Section 122 of the Act and other relevant laws and shall not obstruct or interfere with lawful project development activities.
- (ii) The Project Area Landowners acknowledge the rights of the Developer and Operator as conferred under the Act and undertake to respect the tenure and rights conferred to the respective LNG Project Licences.
- (iii) The Project Area Landowners acknowledge the significance of the uninterrupted project operations and pledge to support the advancement of the LNG Project, assist the LNG Project Companies in controlling any obstructive elements inside and outside their communities or provinces who might attempt to hinder development or production and, where necessary, assist in the removal of any obstructions or blockades or assemblies formed to obstruct or blockade project equipment or facilities.

19. INDEPENDENT ISSUES COMMITTEE

- (i) The parties recognize the need to establish a committee to be called the "Independent Issues Committee (Committee)."
- (ii) The primary function of the Committee will be to gather, deliberate and report to the Department of Petroleum and Energy on matters raised at the LBSA Forum which do not form part of the LBSA negotiations and this Agreement.

- (v) The Parties acknowledge that the program is time bound and will be launched immediately after the conclusion of all the LBSA forums for the wider Hides area and will be concluded by or before 1st February 2010.

20. COMMUNICATION

All communication between the parties hereto will be in writing addressed as shown in the Schedules hereto.

21. GOVERNING LAW AND JURISDICTION

The validity and interpretation of this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the Independent State of Papua New Guinea, and the parties hereto expressly agree to submit disputes arising hereunder to the exclusive jurisdiction of the Courts of the State.

22. SEVERABILITY PROVISIONS

Any provision of this Agreement that is prohibited or unenforceable in any jurisdiction is ineffective as to that jurisdiction to the extent of the prohibition or unenforceability under the Oil and Gas Act 1998 as amended. That does not invalidate the provisions of this Agreement nor affect the validity or enforceability of any provision of Oil and Gas Act or any other applicable law as prescribed in this Agreement.

Legislative process for a declaration of a “free trade” status for Hela City in that event that Hela City is established.

24. AGREEMENTS AND ADDENDUMS

Where there are any references to any further negotiations and agreements any outcome shall form part of this Agreement and be annexed as an addendum.

25. ALTERNATIVE DISPUTE RESOLUTION

The parties agree to resolve disputes as follows:

- (i) Where dispute arises involving the Hides 4 APDL 7 Project Area Landowners, other project area landowners or non-project landowners, those parties shall resolve those disputes by discussion in accordance with relevant customs, alternative dispute resolution and if necessary by recourse to Village or Local Land Court or District Court as appropriate.
- (ii) Where there is a dispute in relation to the sharing of benefits then all monies shall be held in abeyance pending agreement by all clans/villages/tribes/groups within a three (3) month period or 15 January 2010 (which ever occurs first) failing which, the Minister shall intervene to make a determination in accordance with Section 169(8) of the Act.

26. INCONSISTENCY PROVISIONS

In the event of any inconsistency between this Agreement and the UBSA, the UBSA shall prevail.

27. REVIEW CLAUSE

- (i) The review of this Agreement shall occur every five years from the date of execution of this Agreement.
- (ii) The first review shall cover benefits that are implemented during the first five years only.
- (iii) Discovery of additional reserves will trigger a re-determination but will be considered at the time of review.
- (iv) For the purpose of this clause the review under clause 28 (i) relates only to the monitoring of the commitments and undertakings recorded in this Agreement.
- (v) For the purpose of this clause the review relates only to the benefits granted by the State and contained in this Agreement.


28 EXECUTION AND COUNTERPART


